#### THANKS & UPDATES BY GAYLE SWANBECK

Major yard work before our September/October reception was done by Josh Smith. Our almost normal summer rains left us huge crops of grasses and weeds. It was a Herculean task. Way to go, Josh. The back area was again worked on prior to the Storytelling Under the Stars held here in October. Josh used our pulled ocotillo to create a curtain of wood behind the outdoor staged area. He removed or organized years of tiles, stone and wood, and designed a way to light the back yard with spotlights for the stage and ambient lighting for the audience area. It was beautiful.

Inside the gallery, our 97-year old Victorian lady got additional repairs. The upstairs bathroom got a much needed make over, old water stains covered, cracks patched, walls, and trim painted, the toilet repaired, and the floor tiles finally scraped free of paint and back to their natural condition and sealed. Also upstairs our window on the front porch was replaced, as well as one of the curved windows in the turret room. Josh refurbished the one remaining original window that had been stored carefully in our basement for these many years. Both are now awaiting the painting of the building.

Four new dead bolts were also installed upstairs allowing us one master key to access the rooms instead of six separate ones. Downstairs in the School of the Arts, Josh also scraped the ceramic floor tiles and floor board tiles free of some very ugly paint, revealing beautiful pale yellows and blue. What a difference. Also in the School of the Art's back storage room another cleaning, tossing and re-organizing went on. It's been years since I've seen the top of that table. Next comes the storage closet. It is so lovely to work because of your space, not in spite of it.

Outside, Josh covered the Gila woodpecker holes with metal and spot painted them. He also installed a new motion security light that illuminates the back parking lot. This has been a long needed safety improvement.

Congratulations and thanks also go out to Grace and Zoe Rhyne for completing this year's 990's (Federal Financial Disclosure for non-profits). They watched me do it one year, and this year breezed right through it on their own, filing early. This is no small feat and speaks highly of these women's desire to continue growing WomanKraft for many years to come. It's work, but fun work to curate exhibits and produce events, but organizations and businesses can't survive unless the nitty-gritty is attended to: the grant writing, the reports, the banking, the 1099's, the 990's, taxes, insurance, Arizona Corporation Commission Annual Report, the sales sheets, and bills paid. Good work women. I can't tell you, Josh, Zoe and Grace, how proud and grateful I am for your presence here.


