THANKS AND UPDATES BY GAYLE

Many changes, repairs, and improvements have happened here at WomanKraft in the last tri-semester of 2014. School of the Arts workshops produced over 20 mosaic roof tiles to continue bordering our front walkways and flowerbeds. New flowerbeds were created on both sides of the front porch staircase and under the front picture window. Two new Rosemary bushes were planted out front, along with a Dwarf Saint John's Bottlebrush, donated plants green up the area running back to Studios 102 and 103, and the back garden areas now have a variety of spices, herbs and cacti.

Another long length of old sidewalk was pulled and new cement poured to safely level the walk and widen it for handicap accessibility. Indoors we've installed a new set of Cholla lights in the front craft room windows, continuing the outdoor lighting motif. Josh Smith designed and built four boxes with hinged lids for our recyclables. (One in the School of the Arts, two in the gallery, and one for the Sanctuary.) Zoe, Grace, and myself collaged and mulberry papered them. I do believe we have the best looking recycle bins in Tucson, though I confess my bias. Along with our new bins. I went after the three waste baskets in the School and mulberried their faded glory into renewed beauty and more years of service. Why throw it in the landfill when a little bit of time and creativity can turn it into an artistic conversation piece?

Our big project under way is the front fence. The old ocotillo fence has been slowly dying off and no longer serves its purpose of security or beauty. The new fence is all metal and continues the wing design of the front handrails. With some of the metal pieces coming in at twelve feet, Josh has been challenged creating new jigs and extending his work table to handle the sheer size of the panels. It's going to be beautiful! Also purchased for the building is a thirty-two foot extension ladder. As Josh was installing our new security lights, it became quite evident to me that our forty-year old ladder had become a liability. With the outside paint job coming up, there was no way our people were going up on something less than the best. We found a Black and Decker at Lowes being discontinued for the 2015 models. Add that sale price to an additional Black

Friday 20% off and we saved over \$200 on a \$400 ladder.

Finally, let me say that thanks go out again this year to all the people who have contributed so generously to our building fund. We are constantly hearing from people how much safer they feel with the new sidewalks, handrails, and steps. They all compliment us on the beauty of the improvements and how fast they are happening, and I point out that all the best intentions in the world can't buy paint, mortar, metal, etcetera, it takes cash. So once again, thank you for your incredible kindness, thank you for believing in us and our mission here at WomanKraft. You know who you are. In love and gratitude, Gayle Swanbeck




