

THANKS AND UPDATES BY GAYLE SWANBECK

Our January 10th board meeting found all current board members still willing to serve. An anonymous donation will allow Jill Reese to research the historical facts on our beautiful 1918 Queen Ann Victorian building, laying ground work for future grant opportunities and possibly some tax relief.

Our January Rummage Fair took in \$1,603.50 and this year joins other donations to meet the increase we're suffering in taxes and insurance rates. Please remember when casting your vote at the polls that when funding gets cut to the arts and to education organizations like ours face the reality of that budget deficit. When Tucson Pima Arts Council is given only enough funds to grant not 60 but 26 organizations money, and we must compete with the likes of the Tucson Museum of Art, it is our little organization that sees no money, not TMA. It is not TMA's or TPAC's fault; it is the fault of a government that cannot grasp a basic reality. For every \$0.50 invested in the arts our economy sees a \$1.00 return. The arts are vital to our National economy, not the myth of artists feeding at "the public troughs." When you're traveling through our city look hard at all the beauty brought to you through the arts; murals, sculptures, streetcar and bus stops, bridges... now, if you can imagine, no art, but gray cement, gray blocks, gray benches, and no art. We now have, thanks to Grace Rhyne, a monthly event flyer. Ask for it when you don't want a whole hardcopy of the Castle Voice, or pick one up after hours from the new dispenser, designed, built and installed by Josh Smith. It is located on the fence to the left of our front gate. Beautiful, functional, and waterproof. Also check out the QR code on the flyer, linking to our Facebook page which is now kept up by Kat Cronn, who celebrated her 1st year anniversary as an artist and member at WomanKraft in April. Thanks!

Zoe and I tackled a reorganizing of the School of the Arts bathroom storage area – tossing, sorting and passing on to the January Rummage Fair all the extras. Grace went after the hallway storage area, reorganizing all of the magazines and calendars we use in all our collaging workshops and projects. Also done were the cloth, ribbon, and miscellaneous craft material drawers, shelves, and bins. It looks great.

The new front fence is over half completed. Josh has installed all the front panels to the South of our front gate, all the dead ocotillo fencing in the area has been removed, and the trees and cacti trimmed back. Each 8 foot panel is a masterpiece composed of 112 welds, 40 pieces of metal with more than 1,000 welds to complete the fence so far. The results are beautiful and impressive. He is now working on the North sections.

We've created 10 more roof tiles in the School of the Arts workshops and this will allow Josh to extend the sidewalk and garden beds by one more section. Bit by bit the beauty keeps happening.

Studio 102 has undergone some major restorations as well. The ceiling, damaged years ago by rain and age, was hidden beneath cheap fake panels and later suspended cloth, it has now been re-plastered, the walls patched and repainted along with all the trim. Repairs are still needed in the bathroom and will be finished shortly. A huge heartfelt thank you to those people who's donations have made these renovations and improvements happen, you know who you are.

In the gallery, walls were patched, spot painted, and the floors striped and redone. Glen Wilby also managed to remove a tree blocking our front windows

in the main gallery room, and threatening the foundation.

February/March and April/May exhibit thanks go out to the people for making the shows happen: Zoe Rhyne, Grace Rhyne, Josh Smith, Kat Cronn, Patty Lyons, Linda Hill, Gerrie Young, Diane Jackson, Rachel Pace, Paul Brunelle, and Nancy Martin.

Barbara Achord has taken over the position of Membership Coordinator, with great results. Between her organizing the mail/membership list, contacting members with a gentle reminder and Zoe's efforts to have new artist's become members, our numbers are growing steadily each month. Congratulations women.

Thanks also goes out to Grace Rhyne for all the amazing work she is doing with our website, publicity, Mailchimp emails, and photo documentation. At 18 years of age Grace took over the job of Executive Director of WomanKraft and in her 3 years has grown into the job and grown WomanKraft. She has taken on enormous responsibilities and does not disappoint. You are filling some very big shoes left by Linn Lane's death. Thank you.

January was another year's anniversary for Zoe Rhyne in the position of Director of Exhibits. She has shouldered a very big job and has done it beautifully. Each show surpasses the last and our current exhibit for April/May Drawing Down the Muse is in my estimation the best Muse exhibit ever. These two women are forces of Art and Nature, and with the enormous help and skills of Josh Smith are the hope and future of WomanKraft. If you have a moment, don't forget to thank them too.


