

A Collaborative Success: WomanKraft and the Esperanza Dance Project





On March 10th, 2018, WomanKraft partnered with the Esperanza Dance Project to host a live performance fundraiser! The Esperanza Dance Project (EDP), is a local modern dance troupe and non-profit organization, that travels to high schools and community events with a mission to "eradicate stigma, secrecy and shame associated with childhood sexual violence" through a multimedia performance piece entitled "House of Hope".

This type of fundraiser was a first for both organizations. WomanKraft being the host organization and event location, provided 6 spaces in and around the "Castle" grounds for intimate performances by EDP.

Both organizations seem to be grateful for the opportunity to share a chance to create new live art, meet each other, share ideas, and open conversations.

EDP asked 6 emerging choreographers from the company to create short pieces that reflected the theme of empowerment, and 18 dancers performed these new works. Audience members were taken on a guided tour to see the 6 mini performances. The

work created ranged from solos, duets, to quartets, and gave the audience an opportunity to get up close and personal with the dancers, more so than traditional theatre spaces provide. Performances were held in the main gallery room, the freshly renovated upstairs office, the School of the Arts classroom, the driveway, and the front porch. Surprising everyone who attended with the wonderful treasure and adaptability that is the "Castle" WomanKraft has occupied since 1991. With over 80 visitors that day, success would be an understatement!

Grace Rhyne, a dedicated member to both organizations wants to personally extend a most sincere THANK YOU to everyone who came to support, the help from the tour guides, the dancers and choreographers, and all the planning help leading up to the date.
