

REVIEW OF THE ESPERANZA DANCE PROJECT COLLABORATIVE PERFORMANCE AT WOMANKRAFT





Fist I'd like to report on our January rummage sale. It was a stellar sale with many amazing treasures to be found from art supplies, to furniture and beyond. We netted \$2,871.76! It was our best

yet and thanks go out to all our workers, buyers, and especially our donors. You are all just too wonderful for words. WomanKraft accepts donations of clean, working and gently used items all year long. Just give us a call to set up delivery.

Repairs and improvements have continued at a remarkable pace. Josh Smith has finished widening and mosaic roof tile lining the last of our sidewalks. It was no small feat just tearing up the old damaged walk way. Now we are handicap accessible and so much safer for everyone.



Josh also worked on the plumbing repairs in studio #102, including floor and wall repairs. Studio #103 finally got its plaster repaired, walls and trim re-painted, a new bathroom sink with

accompanying repairs, a new shelving unit built into the bathroom, the closet shelves were reinforced, the wooden door planed, rehung, and the floors cleaned up. My studio sure needed attention and upgrades, nothing had been worked on for over 25 years.



Inside the main gallery repairs have begun on our tool room and storage area. The shelves alone are such an organizational blessing. The Branching Out Tree Service was hired to do the major task of getting our huge tamarisk trees under control. They've done an excellent job.

Josh has also continued the exterior painting on our north facing walls. With the trees cut back from the buildings this job can continue with much more safety and ease.



David Silvestri took on the job of studios #102 and #103 prepping and painting the exterior walls. They've received 2 coats of paint as has the trim. He also did some repairs to the wood frame on #102's big window. It looks so good. Great work guys!

Tony Di Angelis has been routinely logging five hours a week and the grounds look terrific. The smaller trees trimmed, weeds pulled, the yard cleaned and raked all add to the overall improved look of our space. He's also been putting in hours, cleaning bathrooms, cleaning our flat roof above The Sanctuary, and helping me restore my studio to useful order again. The words of my high school art teacher, Helen Sears, come back to me. "Work because of your space, not in spite of it." Ah, the wisdom of our elders.

Special thanks go out to Nancy Martin for continuing to shop for our receptions, Darlene Kirk for donations of drinking water, toilet paper, and rummage donations and her time.
