After the rummage sale is over, comes twice a year deep cleaning, repairs, and maintenance by Josh and Zoe. After all the unsold rummage, displays, racks, and tables return to their proper places, begins the repair and maintenance of walls, ceilings, windows, and floors. Cracks and nail holes are patched, the interior walls repainted, and the floors are stripped and re-sealed with Trewax vinyl sealant. Don't let the word vinyl fool you. Its great on wood, so much easier than typical floor re-finishings, cheaper, and long lasting. We buy ours at Ace hardware. Josh's major work on the castle focused on the three small rooms that connect the back gallery door with the School of the Arts, and what a project it was. Floors, walls, and ceilings all had huge holes and lots of crumbling plaster. The old sink was removed and that led to the need to replace a water line. It was well timed, discovered before it finished crumbling and began leaking. The floors once repaired were redone with the vinyl floor covering we've used in the school. (Looks like wood without the maintenance). Fresh paint went on, and shelving went up everywhere possible, maximizing the School's and the Gallery's storage space. It' all so fresh, clean, and accessible and we can actually walk through the rooms. It's been many years since those rooms were totally sorted and the broken and old tossed out. It is so wonderful, thank you Josh and thank you Zoe.

Gratitude is a beautiful and powerful feeling and intention, and we have so much to be grateful for. Lauralee Simons has been helping keep our building's interior clean, Nick Curtis has been taking on our "cyber jobs" including our social media presence, documentation, and learning about and revamping our website. Both of these younger folks are relatively new to WomanKraft as workers, artists and members. Thank you both for your time, your energy, and creativity. Thanks also go out to Barbara Schnauss for returning her worksop fee so a more financially vulnerable teacher can receive pay as our planet's health crisis continues. Thanks to Linda Jordan for continuing to donate her workshops supply costs to the School. Thank you Jon Maranda for typing out exhibit labels, you are a blessing. Thanks Terri McGuire for your abundant donations of tacky glue, pumice stones, art supplies, and rummage. Thank you Darlene Kirk, of Payson, for her continued rummage donations and frequent art purchases. I just delivered 4 pieces to her that she acquired in the Feb/March exhibit. She'd ask me to take some shots on my digital camera of the new works that are up. Unfortunately, few will see this Years Drawing Down the Muse, but we are trying to be creative. Darlene purchased two additional pieces and here in Tucson, artists facilitated two additional sales. Thanks to Roz and Ira Gibel for rummage donations, and apologies for relocating you from Pine, Az to Payson in the last Voice. Thanks to Nancy Martin for thinking of WomanKraft as she downsizes her life and for doing the physical shopping for our receptions and events. Thanks to Jonathan DuHamel for continuing to do our Castle Voice design and doing so much of the photography. Thanks to Barbara Achord for volunteering her time as membership coordinator and donating all the postcard reminders that help so many of us renew our membership. Thanks to Tony DiAngeles for the landscape maintenance that is keeping the grounds looking so good. Kudos to Ingrid and James Aspromatis for their continued generous rummage fair donations and to James for entertaining us at receptions with his collection of vintage phonographs and music. Also let me thank Robert Villa for his always beautiful violin playing. OUR HEALTH AND FINANCES

So far, everyone we know is healthy, and we hope and pray that this will remain true. As you all know, the Gallery and the School have closed until it is safe for us to open our doors again. In the interim, we recognize the loss of income is hurting many of our artists and teachers, and as many of us are self employed, we are already marginally incomed. What some might not be aware of is that many artists piece together their income from more than one source. Artists place their works in as many venues as they can find and some increase their earning power by teaching art. It's a whole pie with a \$100 slice here and a \$40 slice here and \$20 slice there...You get the picture. Last year we had two generous donations from board members totaling \$13,000, of which \$4,000 was expended to cover building insurance. After a meeting, Zoe and I made a decision to use the remaining funds to continue paying our teachers. We will go back to using the regular fund account for the School, which is made up of workshop fees when applicable, donations, and the Grand Foundation grant that provides the free classes to low income people 50

and older. With the gallery closed we have no way to sell art to the public, but hey, if you know an artist check to see if they have a website. Maybe a little cyber shopping or safe arrangements for viewing can be made with them. Lets be creative, but always be safe.

WomanKraft is at the time solvent, and we'll be able to meet our utility bills and upcoming 2nd property tax payment. Our membership fees, art sales %, donations, and government grants when they can be applied to operations will meet the expenses. Thankfully our mortgage was paid off several years ago and that has made all the difference. So please, everyone, stay safe. practice social distancing, wear masks when needed, share resources, don't hoard, give help financially to individuals and organizations if you can. we give heartfelt thanks to all those on the front lines of this crisis. A virus knows no boundaries but neither does love or kindness.
