


NOVEMBER 5 - DECEMBER 23: HOLIDAY BAZAAR 2022

Many thanks to David and Jordana for all your hard work. Your time and your commitment to a job done well are greatly appreciated.

This is the 30th year of our ownership of the Castle, and our 48th year as a non-profit in Arizona. Thirty years! I just can't seem to believe so many years have passed, let alone the 48 years as a non-profit. I joined WomanKraft in the autumn of 1978, and what a journey it has been. Oh, there have been bumps and disappointments, but I must admit, every time I turn into the WomanKraft driveway, I see the beauty of this place: The beautiful building, saved in 1991 from demolition by a handful of determined and committed women. The beautiful grounds, studios, fencing, gate, and murals, all created and maintained by a long list of beautiful people giving of their time and creativity and money. I thank each and every one of you for these beautiful gifts.

The December reception doubled as our celebratory party. Since Covid, we've not been setting out our famous abundance of food and treats, and have settled for liquid refreshments. But on this celebratory occasion, we offered dessert, as well, with a lovely bakery cake.

James Aspromatis entertained us with an evening of mostly classical music. He brought in an Edison Standard Phonograph, and played many cylinder records. The phonograph is spring powered and works as well as it did when it was new in 1907. This was how things were done before most folks had

electricity. James has shared this and a Victor Talking Machine for several of our events. The visitors are always amazed. Thank you, James, for sharing your collection, your knowledge of recording history, the music, and most especially for your time.

Ann Pattison also baked some delicious cupcakes for the occasion. Thank you, Ann, for your lovely contribution to this amazing gathering.

Thanks to all the people who came out to enjoy and celebrate - our old friends and newbies. Thanks to those who purchased art, left donations for their drinks and desserts, and those who remembered the Castle's birthday with cards and checks. Many thanks to the women who set up, staffed, and cleaned up after the reception, including: Terri McGuire, Mary Lou Griggs, Gerrie Young, and Gayle Swanbeck.

She came down for a November 'Thank you, volunteers' luncheon with a truckload of goodies: Two beautiful wooden pedestals that will serve our exhibits for many years to come,
