



#### **UPDATES AND THANKS**

More improvements and repairs have been happening at Womankraft. The fencing on the north side of the property has now been completed using attractive cedar boards. It looks great. Good job, Donald Proffitt. Don and Paul Kemmitz also completed our long time planned outdoor patio (northwest corner of the front yard). It was quite the project. One of the large salt cedar limbs was finally cut, opening up the space and removing the constant maintenance to keep branches from drooping down, blocking the public sidewalk. Next, the ground needed to be cleared of the broken sections of the old ripped sidewalks. Leveling the ground required digging up large surface roots and bringing in fill. Fieldstone slabs were laid, mortared and edged with firebrick and mosaic roof tiles. It's worth a stop by just to check it out. We're hoping to be able to purchase eight chairs and three or four tables, wrought iron preferred. Plastic and wood just have too short a life span for our desert sun. We would love to have them in place for September's opening reception (Saturday, Sept 2, 7-9pm) for the Fall Fever exhibit.

David Silvestri took on more wall and ceiling repairs in the Sanctuary (Jordana's all natural hair and body salon, 520-882-6280). Barbara Kasper has continued to keep both floors of the Castle clean and tidy.

Wisler Electric 520-891-7713 came in and repaired an electrical problem in Nikki's upstairs studio. AC and overhead light fixtures are both working again. We're waiting on an estimate to se about proceeding with an electrical upgrade and a new box to handle the Sanctuary's needs. We've had electrical upgrades done on two past occasions bringing us up to all safety codes, but the ability to draw "juice" when needed would be nice.

Jordana spruced up our downstairs floors to glowing beauty and our docents Nikki Young, Barbara (Jasper) Kasper, Terri McGuire, Mary Lou Griggs, Ingrid Aspromatis and Jacquie Dinnie have been doing wonderfully at receptions and open gallery hours as well as maintaining those deep cleanings. We've never looked better. While writing about our docents, let me put out some deep thank yous for all the extra work

the Century Link debacle caused.

Secondly, I took a hard fall the first week of June, thankfully no broken bones, but I have been house bound since the 6th. These women have stepped up to deal with all the challenges and extra work these situations have created. Your are all just amazing Wonder Women and Womankraft is blessed and our community enriched by your selflessness and dedication. Additional thanks go to Nancy Martin, Don Proffitt, Jordana Silvestri, Gerri Young and Caroline Latron.

Thanks also go out to Traci Kelly, Penelope Kelly, Barbara (Jasper) Kasper and Caroline Latron for finishing seven mosaic roof tiles. sot the new patio edging could be completed. I'd also like to show appreciation to Barbara Achord and Mary Lou Griggs for the work they have been dong keeping up with our membership rolls, sending out reminders and updating new and renewing people. Which leads me to thanking all of you members for that support. Thanks to all the folks who have continued to donate to or January rummage fair. We've got some very nice items waiting to find new homes.
